

The Rapid Alert System for dangerous non-food products operates through a network of 31 countries, who exchange information on products that pose a risk to consumers, and on the measures taken to mitigate this risk and protect consumers.






Most common countries of origin of dangerous products


The European Commission has bilateral and multilateral international relations with non-EU countries, who are included in the work to improve traceability of dangerous products.

Measures taken by notifying countries



When a dangerous product is detected on the market, measures are taken in order to correct, withdraw or recall the dangerous product. The measures can be instructed by the authorities (compulsory measures) and/or initiated by the businesses themselves and agreed with the authority (voluntary measures).

Notifications and follow-up actions by risk level





Notifications since 2003



Every Friday, the European Commission publishes a report of the week's dangerous consumer product notifications, based on information provided by national authorities. These reports include information on the product, the nature of the risk, and the measures taken.
